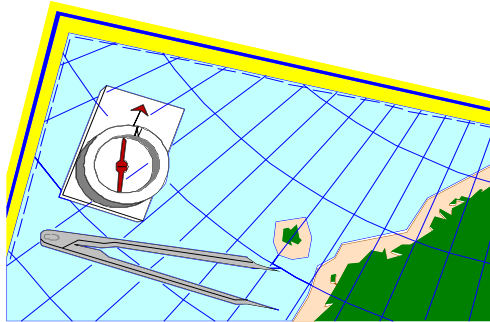

This booklet is like a road map. It will guide you on your journey as you learn to become a servant in the Kingdom of God. You will learn where you are today in your walk with the Lord and what steps you can take to grow toward spiritual maturity.

There are no right and wrong answers to these questions. They are designed to help you see what further preparation you need to be an effective minister. Be honest with yourself as you answer these questions. Determining how to get to where you would like to go requires that you clearly understand where you stand today.

If you were traveling on an interstate freeway and pulled into a rest stop, it would be common for you to check the map, looking for the "you are here" arrow in order to know exactly how much further you have to your final destination. This "Spiritual Growth Map" is designed show where you are on the road to spiritual maturity in Christ.

Don't be afraid to evaluate your past Christian growth as you work through the material. Answer each question without worrying about whether it might put you in a "bad light" in someone's eyes. The person reviewing your responses with you will be fully committed to helping you grow in Christ. Before the first step is made in any extended journey, a wise traveler must know the current location and then obtain proper bearings for the best and shortest route.

Thoughtfully review each question, but don't stress about the way you should respond to the question! Read and answer them quickly, putting down your first impressions. It is just a snapshot of your present spiritual background.

After you have finished this guide, your LIFEgroup Leader will arrange a meeting with you to discuss insights about yourself; things you discover as you complete the materials. During this private time of sharing, recommendations will be offered to help you take the next step in your walk of faith. At The LIFEhouse we are committed to helping one another grow spiritually for life.

Small Group Life Is Important To You!

While many people believe that everything we learn must come from reading books or listening to lectures, most of what we learn in life is caught, not taught. Most of us learn by observing others and then doing it ourselves. The disciples learned from Jesus this way. Learning by watching others and imitating them is called modeling. The art of relating to others is not learned from reading books. To learn how to relate, we must watch others relate. Books can give us information about relationships, but we must observe people who are doing what the books talk about!

We need Godly models to help us establish habits and values that reflect what we believe. We enter the family of God at the moment we asked Christ to take His rightful throne in our hearts. We have spiritual parents, brothers and sisters who help us learn to live in Christian community. We need relationships with people we can identify with and whose actions we can imitate.

The small group provides the best opportunity for understanding what it really means to be a Christian. We are able to hear personal stories of faith and trust as we share our unique trials and ministry opportunities. We model for one another what it means to honor Christ in all things. Perhaps your participation in a small group will be the very first time in your life that you experience true biblical community in the family of God.

We learn community by participating in it and not by just observing. Learn to give love as well as receive it. Learn to be sensitive to others. For example, avoid dominating a small group discussion. This chokes off sharing by other small group members. Prepare yourself beforehand by listening to God so that you can build up others who need your affirmation. Enter into the experience with all your heart! There will be more mature Christians you can select as good patterns for your own life. In time, you will become a model to those who are younger than you in Christ.

"I Can't Do It All Alone"

Every LIFEgroup member should become a part of a living chain of people who love and build up one another. Being helped, and being a helper - this is the pattern of the New Testament Church. Each of us needs a special person that can give us accountability, encouragement, and challenge us during the week.

As a new LIFEgroup member, you will learn much about your walk with Christ over the next few months. You will encounter many changes that will prove exciting. This growth in Christ will depend on your being attached to someone in your small group who has taken three or four steps ahead of you. This person, called an "Accountability Partner" (Soul Brother or Soul Sister), will show you the next step as you journey toward maturity.

Your LIFEgroup Leader will be responsible for linking you with your "Partner". Together you will develop a relationship by growing through daily struggles and bearing each other's burdens. Seek your small group leader's guidance to discover the person with whom you can meet each week.

Keep in touch with your "Partner". Meet together weekly. In addition, as special needs arise you will find yourselves spending hours



together, as good friends do. Your time together will also include fun and laughter. Although your LIFEgroup Leader will always be available to you, your primary helper will be your own "Partner".

As new Christians enter the LIFEgroup, they will also need an Accountability Partner. When you are ready, your LIFEgroup Leader will ask you to be a "Partner". Do not overlook this opportunity to put into practice what you have learned as a member of the group!

You will find that these "people links" throughout the week enhance the weekly LIFEgroup meeting. As the group grows and multiplies, usually in nine to twelve months, you will develop new relationships and new friends. But you will always consider the old friendships special!



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
